- Prepare material and Subcontract Flow Control for Projects
- Procure materials and sub-contract services for projects
- Keep and log copies of all site records
- Apply cost codes for all plant, materials, equipment and items of works specified
- Vet all requisitions and petty cash vouchers
- Prepare minutes of meetings when required
- Assist all project managers in preparation of correspondence to all companies and personnel involved in designated projects
- Assist in managing subcontracts work on site
- Assist Senior QS in preparation of Scope of Works / Bills of Quantities and Specifications.
